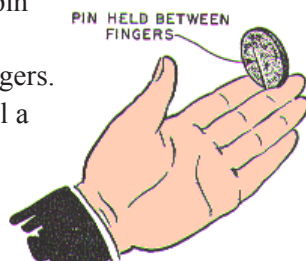

## COIN BALANCE

### REQUIREMENTS:

One large coin, one straight pin

Have a regular straight pin concealed in one hand, between the first two fingers. With the other hand, pull a coin out of your pocket or borrow a coin and let it be examined by the audience.



Lay it down on top of the straight pin in your other hand. Now, raise the coin to a standing position near the ends of your fingers. As you do, raise the straight pin with it making sure no one but you knows the pin is there. Keep pressure on the pin held between your fingers and the coin will balance there as if held by unseen forces. After a few moments, slowly release pressure on the pin and it will let the coin gently drift back down onto your fingers! Don't forget to get rid of the pin while people are examining the coin again!
